REGULAR MEETING 1

The City Council of the City of Sherwood met for a regular meeting on March 25, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Those present were Mayor Virginia R. Young, City Attorney Steve Cobb, City Clerk Angela Nicholson, Council Members Brooks, Harmon, Lilly, McMinn, Sanders, Williams and Broderick. Council Member Heye arrived at 6:09 p.m.

Terrance Underwood, Pastor of New Beginnings Church, led in prayer, and the Pledge of Allegiance was given to the flag.

Council Member Brooks, seconded by Council Member Sanders, made a motion, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on February 25, 2019 as transcribed. The roll call vote was unanimous.

Mayor Young opened discussion for the January and February 2019 financials. No comments were made.

Council Member Brooks, Chairman of the Advertising and Promotion Commission, stated the commission did meet. The next meeting will be April 3, 2019 at 3:00 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Council Member Harmon, Chairman of the Parks and Recreation Committee, stated the committee did meet. There was a field trip to the new Splash Pad.

Council Member Sanders, Chairman of the Personnel Committee, stated the committee did not meet. The next scheduled meeting is April 4, 2019 at 5:30 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Council Member McMinn, Chairman of the Senior Citizen Committee, stated the committee did not meet. The annual Senior Citizen Fish Fry and Silent Auction is scheduled for April 27, 2019 and they are still in need of donations.

Council Member Lilly, Chairman of the Street Committee, stated the committee did meet.

Council Member Williams, stated that the Arkansas Department of Transportation, AR DOT, will be placing a "Do Not Turn Sign" at the Wildwood exit for traffic traveling North on 67/167.

Resolution No. 7-2019, entitled, "A RESOLUTION APPOINTING KYLE BLAKELY TO SERVE ON THE SHERWOOD STREET COMMITTEE" was read. Council Member Williams, seconded by Council Member Brooks, made a motion to adopt the resolution. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Council Member Heye absent at the time of vote.

Ordinance No. 2245, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2018 GENERAL FUND BUDGET ORDINANCE NO. 2172, THE 2018 STREET FUND BUDGET ORDINANCE NO. 2173, THE 2018 WASTEWATER BUDGET ORDINANCE NO. 2174, AND THE 2018 ADVERTISING AND PROMOTION COMMISSION BUDGET ORDINANCE NO. 2169; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES" was read for the first time. Council Member Harmon, seconded by Council Member Sanders, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the second reading. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Council Member Heye absent at time of vote. The ordinance was read for the second time. Council Member Brooks, seconded by Council Member Harmon, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the third and final reading. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Council Member Heye absent at time of vote. The ordinance was read for the third time. Council Member Brooks, seconded by Council Member Sanders, made a motion to adopt the ordinance. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Council Member Heye absent at time of vote. The emergency clause passed with a roll call vote of 7 ayes. Council Member Heye absent at time of vote.

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REGULAR MEETING 2

A proposed ordinance entitled, "An ordinance amending the zoning for the property located at 7225 Highway 107 to remove the Conditional Use allowing the rental of moving type trucks and trailers" was read one time. Brooklyn Parker, Attorney for U Storage and Rory Thompson, owner of U Storage, addressed the council concerning the issues in question. Ms. Parker stated that her client has been trying to work with the conditional use placed on U Storage but the restrictions are too hard. Ms. Parker stated that Mr. Thompson has businesses in other locations of Arkansas and the conditions are not as restrictive as Sherwood. After discussion concerning the issue it was agreed that the City and U Storage would work together to find a resolution.

Resolution No. 8-2019, entitled, "A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTER-LOCAL AGREEMENT REGARDING FUTURE MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS TO THE ONEIDA BRIDGE" was read. Council Member Heye, seconded by Council Member Harmon, made a motion to adopt the resolution. The roll call vote was unanimous.

A proposed ordinance entitled, "*An ordinance appropriating additional funds from the General Fund 2019 Budget for the remodeling of the former Amy Sanders Library for the City of Sherwood, Arkansas, declaring an emergency; and for other purposes*" was read. City Engineer Richard Penn addressed the council and explained the recent bids that came in for the remodel project and the need for the additional funds. Council Member Harmon, seconded by Council Member Williams, made a motion to amend the ordinance in Section 1 to \$280,000.00. The roll call vote was unanimous. **Ordinance No. 2246, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM THE GENERAL FUND 2019 BUDGET FOR THE REMODELING OF THE FORMER AMY SANDERS LIBRARY OF THE CITY OF SHERWOOD, ARKANSAS, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"** was read as amended. Council Member Harmon, seconded by Council Member Sanders, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the second reading as amended. The roll call vote was unanimous. The ordinance was read for the second time as amended. Council Member Brooks, seconded by Council Member McMinn, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the third and final reading as amended. The roll call vote was unanimous. The ordinance was read for the third time. Council Member Brooks, seconded by Council Member Harmon, made a motion to adopt the ordinance. The roll call vote was unanimous. The emergency clause passed with a unanimous roll call vote.

Under New Business:

Mayor Young announced that the Public Works Department will have a crew working at night to find street lights that are out. Mayor Young asked the Council Members to contact Public Works if they know of any street lights that are out.

Mayor Young asked the Council Members to give her feedback concerning the priority of the usage of the small library located on the South side of Sherwood.

Mayor Young stated that the census officially kicks off April 1, 2020. Mayor Young would like to form a committee to help Sherwood get the citizens of Sherwood educated on the importance of filling out the census information. Mayor Young stated that Sherwood had a successful 2010 census.




Council Member Sanders announced that the Opening Ceremonies will be Friday, April 12, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. on Field 1.
