REGULAR MEETING 1

The City Council of the City of Sherwood met for a regular meeting on May 28, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Those present were Mayor Virginia R. Young, City Attorney Steve Cobb, City Clerk Angela Nicholson, Council Members Brooks, Harmon, Lilly, McMinn, Heye, Sanders, and Broderick. Council Member Williams absent.

Council Member Tim McMinn led in prayer, and the Pledge of Allegiance was given to the flag.

Council Member Brooks, seconded by Council Member Heye, made a motion, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on April 22, 2019 as transcribed. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Council Member Williams absent.

Mayor Young opened discussion for the April 2019 financials. No comments were made.

Council Member Harmon, seconded by Council Member Sanders, made a motion to waive the reading requirement on the ordinances. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Council Member Williams absent.

Council Member Brooks, Chairman of the Advertising and Promotion Commission, stated the commission did meet. The next scheduled meeting is June 5, 2019 at 3:00 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Council Member Harmon, Chairman of the Parks and Recreation Committee, stated the committee did not meet. The next scheduled meeting is June 10, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Council Member Sanders, Chairman of the Personnel Committee, stated the committee did not meet. The next scheduled meeting is June 6, 2019 at 5:30 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Ordinance No. 2251, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING DISTRICTS MAP AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES" regarding 7900 Jacksonville Cut Off Road, was read. Rob Middleton, Chairman of the Sherwood Planning Commission was available for questions from the council. Council Member Brooks, seconded by Council Member McMinn, made a motion to adopt the ordinance. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Council Member Williams absent.

A proposed ordinance entitled, "*An ordinance amending the Sherwood Zoning Code and for other purposes*" was read one time. Rob Middleton, Chairman of the Sherwood Planning Commission stated the purpose of this ordinance was to clarify language in the zoning code, to be in compliance with state statute, and address the public hearing requirements concerning appeals. This ordinance will address the requirements of the Sherwood Board of Adjustments and assign certain duties back to the Sherwood Planning Commission. Discussion took place. Council Member Harmon, seconded by Council Member Lilly, made a motion to table the ordinance for one (1) month. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Council Member Williams absent.

Council Member McMinn, Chairman of the Sherwood Senior Citizen Center Committee, stated there was no report from the committee.

Ordinance No. 2252, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM THE WASTEWATER FUND 2019 BUDGET FOR CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SHERWOOD NORTH WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT, TO AUTHORIZE ENTERING INTO CONTRACT, TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES" was read. Council Member McMinn, seconded by Council Member Lilly, made a motion to adopt the ordinance. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Council Member Williams absent. The emergency clause passed with a roll call vote of 7 ayes. Council Member Williams absent.

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REGULAR MEETING 2

Council Member Lilly, Chairman of the Street Committee, stated the committee did meet. Council Member Lilly updated the council on the Lee Avenue street repairs. The final plans have been submitted and will go out for bid this week and the project is on schedule to be completed the first part of July. Council Member Lilly advised that progress is being made on the projects from the sales tax bond and it is possible that the Kohl's Extension could be finished this year. Council Member Heye asked if a sidewalk list has been submitted. Council Member Lilly stated the Street Committee did go over the list and the list should be submitted at the next meeting.
