REGULAR MEETING 1

The City Council of the City of Sherwood met for a regular meeting on June 22, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Those present were Mayor Virginia R. Young, City Attorney Steve Cobb, City Clerk Angela Nicholson, Council Members Brooks, Harmon, Lilly, McMinn, Heye-Townsell, Sanders, Williams and Broderick.

Council Member McMinn led in prayer, and the Pledge of Allegiance was given to the flag.

Council Member Brooks, seconded by Council Member Lilly, made a motion, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on May 26, 2020 as transcribed. The roll call vote was unanimous.

Mayor Young opened discussion for the May 2020 financials. No comments were made.

Council Member Brooks, Chairman of the Advertising and Promotion Commission, stated the commission did meet. There will not be a July commission meeting. The annual 4th of July celebration will only include fireworks. The parking lot at Sherwood Forest will open at 7:00 p.m. and the fireworks should begin around 9:15 p.m.

Council Member Harmon, Chairman of the Parks and Recreation Committee, stated the committee did meet. The next meeting will be July 13, 2020 at 6 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Council Member Sanders, Chairman of the Human Resources Committee, stated the committee did not meet. The next meeting will be July 2, 2020 at 5:30 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Ordinance No. 2308, entitled, "An ordinance amending the official zoning districts map and for other purposes" regarding 7517 Highway 107 was read. Discussion took place regarding the rezoning request. Rob Middleton, Chairman of the Planning Commission and Mr. Pitts, a representative for the owner of the property, were available for discussion. Council Member Heye-Townsell, seconded by Council Member Harmon, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the second reading. The roll call vote was unanimous. The ordinance was read for the second time. Council Member Heye-Townsell, seconded by Council Member McMinn, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the third and final reading. The roll call vote was unanimous. The ordinance was read for the third time. Council Member Lilly, seconded by Council Member Heye-Townsell, made a motion to adopt the ordinance. The roll call vote was unanimous.

Council Member McMinn, Chairman of the Senior Citizen Committee, stated the Senior Citizen Center will open on July 6, 2020. There will not be potlucks or bean bag baseball. Masks will be required.

Council Member Lilly, Chairman of the Street Committee, stated the committee did meet.

Resolution No. 11-2020, entitled, "A resolution by the City Council of Sherwood, Arkansas, extending the contract for residential recyclable material collection and authorizing the Mayor to execute the contract extension" was read. A workshop was held at 5:00 p.m. regarding this resolution. Council Member Lilly, seconded by Council Member Brooks, made a motion to adopt the resolution. The roll call vote was unanimous.

Resolution No. 12-2020, entitled, "A resolution that Sherwood is Essential: In Support of Fair, Direct Federal Emergency Support to reopen and rebuild local American economies" was read. Council Member Williams, seconded by Council Member Sanders, made a motion to adopt the resolution. The roll call vote was unanimous.


Under announcements:
